In the longer term, there are now third- or fourth-generation Palestinian refugees. While the Syrian crisis is now in its seventh year and the number of registered refugees from Syria nears five million, others in the region – from Iraq and Palestine, as well as refugees coming from outside the region, such as Afghans, Sudanese and Somalis – remain in situations of protracted displacement, whether as refugees in neighboring countries or third countries, or as internally displaced persons.
