Academic Progress

Students will be placed on academic probation when their GPA falls below 3.0 grade point average. Students will have one semester in which to bring their average back above 3.0. Failure to do so will lead to dismissal from the program.

Students who receive an F for any course will be dismissed from the program, subject to the right of appeal. All appeals must be submitted in writing to the Chair of the Department of History and Political Science and are then subject to review by the National Security Affairs Admissions Committee.

All cases of documented plagiarism or cheating will lead to automatic dismissal from the program. Reports of plagiarism and cheating are first reported by faculty, with supporting documentation, to the Chair of the Department of History and Political Science. Students accused of plagiarism or cheating may submit an appeal in writing to the Chair of the Department of History and Political Science which will then be adjudicated by the National Security Affairs Admissions Committee.
