### What You'll Study

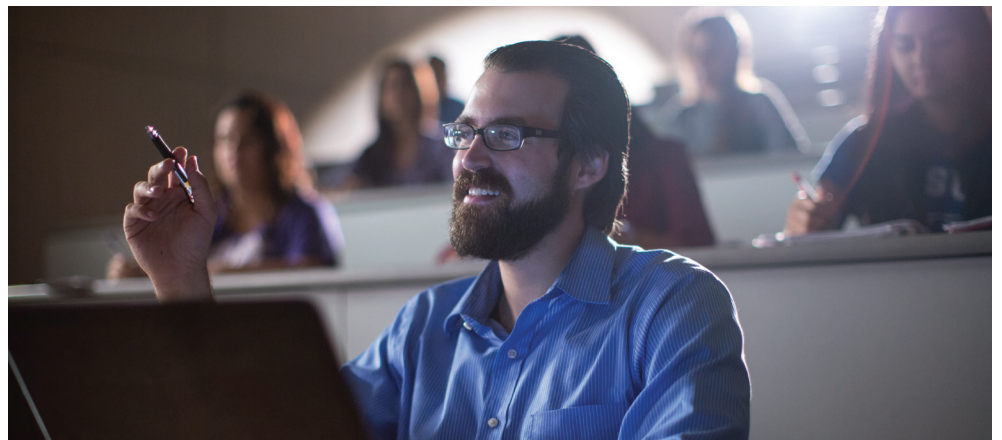
