Clinical Practice

In 1976, having completed my Master's Degree in Social Psychology and while preparing to embark on my Doctoral Dissertation, I explored coursework in Marriage and Family Therapy and made the decision to shift from a research oriented career to a clinical career. As a Social Psychologist I had long been interested in the relation aspects of human behavior, and Marriage and Family Therapy, based on Systems theories, was a natural transition. My earliest experiences as a clinician and as a trainer were based on systemic ideas including Structural family therapy as well as Natural Systems ideas. In the late '70s and early '80's I became more interested in ideas coming from Milan and the Ackerman Clinic in New York which shifted focus away from pathology inside individuals and systems towards more collaborative, strength based approaches. This direction has continued in my practice, teaching and training, and much of my work is currently informed by post-structuralist, systemic based models, particularly Narrative Therapy.

Grants and grant applications

Homebuilders Project (2002). This was a proposal for a three year project to implement and evaluate the Homebuilders model of family preservation. The proposal was submitted to the Children's Services Council of Broward. The grant request was in the amount of \$1.1 million. Grant not awarded.

The Healthy Kids Project (2003). This project was proposed in conjunction with Doctoral student Alexandra Puricelli. It was designed to develop and assess the effectiveness of a multi-level effort aimed at promoting healthy lifestyles among all adolescents, and at reducing adolescent obesity in particular. Grant proposal submitted to the President's Faculty Research and Development Grants. The grant request was in the amount of \$10,000. Grant awarded by the Broward County Quality of Life Scholarship Award in the amount requested.

Community Nutrition awareness project (2004) This project was designed to bring nutrition awareness to the Broward County community through the development of website to provide information, presentations to the adult community, presentations to children and families using a costumed character, "Snappy the Orange", and development of community gardens. Funding was requested in the amount of \$150,000 from the Office of the Attorney General, State of Florida. Grant was awarded in the amount requested.

The effects of child rearing settings on the emergence of autobiographical memory. (2006). Proposed with Alex Cuc and Michael Reiter. This is a study designed to explore the development of autobiographical memory by investigating onset of this memory in middle aged and elderly adults based on factors of gender and child rearing setting. The grant request was proposed to the President's Faculty Scholarship Committee for \$10,000. The award was not granted.

The relationship of model of therapy practice and therapist self-care needs. (2013). Proposed with Dr. Isabel Thompson and Dr. Shannon Ray along with Dr. Barry Nierenberg and doctoral students from SHSS and CPS. This mixed-method study is designed to assess the relationship between the requirements of a therapist's model of therapy and their need for self care, it is hypothesized that models that locate the cause for therapeutic improvement within the therapists will be related to more need for therapist self-care than models that lead to a more collaborative or strength-based relationship. Grant presented for review for the President's Faculty Research Grant for \$10,000. The award was not granted.

The relationship between EEG and hormonal responses to participation in an interview informed by narrative therapy practices. (2013). Proposed with Dr. Jamie Tartar, Dr. Mercedes Fernandez, and Dr. Jintao Zhang, and a Doctoral Student from SHSS. This study will investigate the effects of two components of a narrative interview; evocative discussion of a prior problem, and an evocative conversation about a triumph related to that problem. It is hypothesized that specific, predictable changes in EEG readings as well as assessments of cortisol and alpha-amylase levels will correlate with the type of the conversation being held. Grant presented for review for the Presidents Faculty Research grant for \$10,000. Grant awarded in the amount requested.

Contract related activities

Resource Based Solutions (RBS). (2003 – 2006). This workshop series was developed in collaboration between SHSS and the Children’s Services Council of Broward. The series was initiated in 2003 and continued through 2006. Workshops were offered at no cost to providers of services to children and families regarding brief, solution-focused approaches to problems. This series has served over 300 participants through over 30 workshop presentations, and has generated in excess of \$50,000 in funding for this series.

Jumpstart to Permanency (JTP). (2004 – 2005). This project is a collaborative effort between SHSS faculty and adjuncts from both DCAR and DFT and the Children’s Home Society of Broward (CHS). This team of University personnel and CHS administrators developed a unique program to address the ongoing problem of children remaining in foster care for extended periods of time. Integral to the program developed are both Systems Facilitators, individuals who work with the entire system of stakeholders as the “client”, and Family Therapists who work with families involved using systemic approaches. SHSS faculty and adjuncts have served in an advisory capacity and three SHSS students have been hired either as Systems Facilitators, Family Therapists or both. To date this program has brought in excess of \$40,000 to SHSS in support of these activities and increased funding is being sought.
